<b>Strengthen your learning</b>	Explore your local area? Is there anything like a secret garden near where you live? Complete one exercise video or create your own exercise activity for someone in your family.
<b>Deepen your learning</b>	Whilst in the secret garden, you meet a bird that can talk. What would you talk to it about? <b>*worth 10 reward points</b>	Write a diary entry of your day in the secret garden. Think about your punctuation! <b>*worth 20 reward points</b>	Help either a friend or sibling with some work, working together to understand what you have to do. <b>*worth 10 reward points</b>	Create a circuit. It should have at least 6 activities of your choice, try and encourage your family to do it. Think about circuits we have done in PE. <b>*worth 50 reward points</b>
<b>Take the challenge!</b>	In the secret garden you find a rusty old shed. What is inside it? How big is it? How did you get into it? Write a short story about the shed. <b>*worth 20 reward points</b>	Do some role play of your time in the secret garden, encourage family members to take part and you can even write your own script. <b>*worth 50 reward points</b>	Write a thank you card for someone who is still working at this difficult time. What are you thankful for? What would you say to them if you could? <b>*worth 20 reward points</b>	Try some yoga moves if you can.
