Strengthen your learning	Explore the local community and see what you can find. Can you create things to place out whilst on your walk, such as a painted rock?	Research Captain Tom Moore and what he has done for the NHS during this pandemic. Write some notes about his achievements.	Can you help out a family member by bringing in the shopping or unpacking the shopping.	Can you do laps around your garden like Captain Tom Moore? How many can you do? Set yourself a target and see if you can achieve it. Don't forget to take pictures to show your friends.
Deepen your learning	Whilst out exploring your local area, is there any new flowers or plants that you haven't seen before. If so try and remember these flowers and do some research on these when you get home.	Can you write a thank you letter to someone who has been helpful either to you or others during this time, it can be anyone of your choice. *worth 20 reward points	Is there something you can do in the community to help out? You could try pick up any litter off the floor or leave some activities out on the drive for children to do. *worth 10 reward points	What challenge can you set yourself to achieve that you could raise money for? Try to push yourself, it could be a sponsored walk or sponsored run around your garden. Can you get any of your friends involved? *worth 20 reward points
Take the challenge!	Make a fact file about your local community. What is there to visit? What wildlife is around? What plants and nature is there that you can see? Try and draw your own pictures and make it as colourful as you can! *worth 20 reward points	How can one person make such a difference? Is there something you would like to do to make a difference in our world? Write down what you would like to do or achieve in the future and how you are going to achieve this. *worth 50 reward points	Can you make a card for someone to make them smile during this time? Think carefully about who you want to give it too and try and make it as neat as possible, remember to take pictures to show your friends. *worth 20 reward points	Once you have completed your own challenge, see if you can set a challenge for other people to join in or create a video for people to take part in. It could be similar to Joe Wickes or you can make your own. Don't forget to share your video. *worth 20 reward points
