A frosty and chilly end to the week! Please wrap your children up nice and warm, and please label coats, scarves and gloves. Children do need to be outside for play and lunchtimes whenever possible.

It's been so good this week to focus on science. Each class has a science box, delivered from Delta, with science equipment in. We believe science should be a practical lesson wherever possible. The photo below is of Miss Slater, showing pupils how sunglasses protect our eyes from harmful UV rays. Y3 have been proving that sun protection cream shields our skin from UV rays. They've used UV beads, a UV torch and a range of different sun creams. What a great experiment.

Just quickly, our C system is really easy to learn. For wrong choices we say "C1 choice" then "C2 warning" then "C3 consequence"







# Early Years

This week Reception have been exploring 1 more and 1 less in maths, extending their learning with representing numbers to 5. In writing we are busy learning about our story The Gingerbread man. I wonder If they can retell you the story?




### Year 6
